Definitions

Plagiarism

Plagiarism is the act of representing as one's own original work the creative works of another, without appropriate acknowledgment of the author or source.

Artificial Intelligence

The inappropriate use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) is considered a form of plagiarism and constitutes a breach of the academic integrity policy. Inappropriate uses of AI include:

- Submitting work when an individual has used Al tools or services to generate, paraphrase, or summarise text that is not their original work.
- Using Al tools or services to answer questions or complete whole/part sections of assessment tasks.
- Using Al tools or services to manipulate, fabricate, or falsify data, evidence, or results that are part of your academic work.

Collusion

Collusion is the presentation by a student of an assessment piece, as his or her own which is in fact the result in whole or in part of unauthorised collaboration with another person or persons. Collusion involves the cooperation of two or more students in plagiarism or other forms of academic misconduct.

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Breaches

When a breach of academic integrity is identified students will receive a resubmission date for their work. As a result of the breach in academic integrity the student will receive a 'zero' for the task. Parents/carers will receive a notification via SEQTA regarding the nature of the breach. The Overall Result on the Semester Report will therefore be impacted. Subject teacher will notify on SEQTA the Homeroom Teacher, relevant Year Level Leader and relevant Learning Area Leader.

To avoid any breaches in academic integrity students should:

- do their research and course work honestly
- not engage in plagiarism and cheating
- respect their peers and teachers in academic work
- acknowledge all assistance in all academic work
- reference all work used from other sources
- treat team members respectfully and appropriately in sharing work tasks, information, and responsibilities
- meet all deadlines and due dates for all tasks
- avoid any disruption of research, teaching and learning

Extra Support

The student handbook and library portal page contain a guide for students on how to reference (Harvard referencing system), which they are to use where it is required.

Repeated breaches will be dealt with in a case-by-case manner by the relevant Year Level Leader.
